

POE Director's Report

The Long Beach Chapter of AGO June 26, 2022 - July 1, 2022

The Long Beach Chapter held its first-ever Pipe Organ Encounter (POE) from June 26, 2022, to July 1, 2022. In short, the POE was a success, a difficult accomplishment for even large chapters and for which our small chapter should be especially proud.

Eleven students, ranging in age from 13 to 18 years old, came from across the country to attend the POE. Six students were from California, and the remaining five students were from Arizona, Nevada, Idaho, Illinois, and Wisconsin. Moreover, the students came with a range of experience levels, with three students having never had an organ lesson before and the other students having studied the organ from one to eight years. Nine of the students were attending a POE for the first time.

The students had daily private lessons, provided by a faculty which included David Ball, Kyle Black, Ethan Haman, Grant Holcomb, Hyunju Hwang, and Tom Mueller. Twelve dedicated, wonderful volunteers drove the students to and from their lessons and served as chaperones during their practice times. The lessons were held at ten local churches: Bethany Lutheran Church, St. Thomas of Canterbury, California Heights United Methodist Church, St. Timothy's Lutheran Church, Bay Shore Community Church, Our Saviour Lutheran Church, Trinity Lutheran Church, First Congregational UCC, The Gathering Lutheran Church, and Covenant Presbyterian Church.

The students also attended daily workshops, including "An Introduction to Organ Builder and Design" by Kevin Cartwright, "Hymn Playing" by Tom Mueller, "Improvisation" by Ethan Haman, "Effective Practice Strategies" by Kyle Black, "Orgelkids" by Linda Brown, "AGO and You" by Grant Holcomb (Handout provided by Leslie Wolf Robb), and "Alexander Technique for Organists" by Eileen Troberman.

Each day concluded with an evening concert, which was open to the public and well attended. The kickoff concert was held on Sunday evening at Covenant Presbyterian Church and performed by six organists: David Ball, Peter Bates, Hyunju Hwang, Tom Mueller, Emma Whitten, and Emma Yim. On Monday evening, David Ball and three Christ Cathedral organists, Alyce Reynold, Hubert Tran, and Emma Whitten, performed at Christ Cathedral in Garden Grove. All students were given an opportunity to explore Christ Cathedral's magnificent Hazel Wright organ after the concert. On Tuesday evening, Hyunju Hwang and Tom Mueller

performed at The Neighborhood Church in Palos Verdes Estates. On Wednesday, Ethan Haman and Grant Holcomb gave another joint concert which included improvisation on two themes chosen by the students and a cryptogram theme of P-O-E-L-O-N-G-B-E-A-C-H.

The students also enjoyed field trips, including an Organ Crawl to Segerstrom Concert Hall in Irvine. Brian Sawyer, the curator, led the tour, and Peter Bates demonstrated the 75 ranks, 4,322 pipes Fisk organ. The Organ Crawl then moved to Christ Cathedral. Kevin Cartwright, the curator, led the tour, and David Ball and Emma Whitten demonstrated the might of the newly restored Hazel Wright organ and its 17,000-plus pipes. Finally, the Organ Crawl moved to The Neighborhood Church with its Glatter-Götz/Rosales organ.

The students also had a chance to visit a private residence in Palos Verdes Estates to see a home-built organ. The owner, a retired businessman who loves organs, encouraged the young future organists to build their own home organs. Lastly, the students visited O'Neal Pipe Organs, where they learned more about pipe voicing, console layouts, tuning, and leathering. Each student also received a unique key-chain souvenir made from an organ stop knob.

In addition to the many concerts, tours, and workshops, the students also participated in fun, frolicking activities from enjoying ice cream to visiting the beach to hearing the LA Philharmonic play at the Hollywood Bowl while watching a Harry Potter movie.

The POE concluded with a student recital on Friday. Following the recital, the students were presented with certificates of participation, took group photographs, and enjoyed a final reception.

The POE would have been impossible to hold without the truly amazing help of our many volunteers and supporting organizations. Funding came from many generous sources, and we were deeply grateful for the support of the Guild members, local churches, businesses, and AGO chapters around the country who supported us. Further, our six outstanding POE Committee members, 14 local churches, 12 drivers and chaperones, 17 artists, faculty, and workshop presenters, donors, logo designer, and AGO Headquarter staff all helped make the 2022 Long Beach POE 2022 an incredible experience. One student said the POE changed his life. Thank you all for making this possible!

Reflections on Our First POE

Back before the Pandemic, I was there. I was in the Committee meetings, pushing for making sure the kids (some of whom might never have been exposed to real pipes before) would be exposed to tracker action, and pushing for a visit to the Printing Museum as a non-musical excursion (maybe for our next POE). I was there shepherding Russ Litchfield's brochure through a local Kinko's, then folding them myself on a finicky old folding machine at the Museum, to save on folding charges, and printing the reply envelopes myself, by letterpress, in the middle of a special event at the Museum.

I didn't have nearly so active a role when the POE finally happened, but I was still covering it in *The Principal*, running a special summer issue, and then running enough extra copies of that issue so that all the kids, and all the guest instructors, could get one. Other than newsletters, I wasn't involved in any of the printed materials; what I saw (mainly the Program booklet for the public events) looked very well done, albeit somewhat different from how I would have designed it myself.

And I made it to two out of the five public events. I didn't make it to the opening event, and it should come as no surprise (at least to anybody who knows me, and knows my opinion of rank count as the measure of an organ) that I didn't make it to the Christ Cathedral, even though it was practically in my back yard.

But what would it look like if the Chapter's resident self-described "militant tracker-backer" missed the Neighborhood Church event (even though the drive requires a substantial chunk of the battery capacity of my 2018 Leaf)? And given that I have an interest in "whiz kid" musicians, and encouraging the next generation (I rarely miss *From the Top*), and being a student musician myself, how could I miss the Student Recital?

The Neighborhood Church event went well. Both Dr. Hwang and Dr. Mueller played well, and I couldn't help noticing that after the recital, a few of the kids availed themselves of an opportunity to try a superbly engineered tracker organ for themselves. As to the Student Recital, I went in expecting a veritable parade of "whiz kids" who could play me under the table, any day of the week, and that is what I saw and heard

(including a couple who could probably do it wearing "Ove-Gloves" and Ugg Boots).

After the performance, I had an opportunity to talk with a number of the kids, and my general impression is that they enjoyed everything from the lessons to the recitals, to the newsletters enclosed in their welcome packets.

In short, we did it, and now that we've managed to climb the rather steep learning curve of how to put on a POE, and joined the ranks of AGO Chapters who've done so successfully, I look forward to the next one.
