medical emergency but am happy to report that all the tests returned perfect, although driving is off limits until April. I had to put everything on hold for about 3 weeks while all this was sorted out.


So, back in the saddle! Time to catch up.

For our next meeting: CONCERT


SUNDAY FEBRUARY 23, 2020 at 2pm. at First Congregational church of Long Beach

Members' Recital, March 3rd

Right on the heels of Dr. Luedecke's afternoon recital, we have our March event, a Tuesday evening Members' Recital at Covenant Presbyterian, celebrating the 150th anniversary of the birth of French organist and composer Louis Vierne (1870-1937).

Organists Peter Bates, Marc Dickey, Kent Eggert, Hyunju Hwang, and Robert York will be performing selections from 24 Pièces en Style Libre, Op. 31, the Third Organ Symphony, Trois Improvisations, Messe Basse, and Pieces de Fantaisie, Op. 53.

As noted above, this will also be when all voting members of the Chapter will vote on next year's officers.

I, too, was impressed and delighted with the program Russ presented back in January. In addition to having to sort through the pieces and learn a very nice selection of them, he also had to deal with not one, but *two* very late changes of venue. And while the program was clearly intended to demonstrate potentially useful new works, for those with a practical need for them, it was also quite enjoyable for those like myself, who have neither a practical use for the pieces, nor the chops to play them.

And also, my compliments to George's Greek Cafe, for an excellent dinner.

As I type this, I have just heard the news that Alison Luedecke would be the substitute artist for February 23rd, after Gregoire Roland had to cancel. As it happens, I've met Dr. Luedecke, I've heard her perform at Spreckels a number of times, and I have an autographed copy of her *Beckerath Retrospective 2-CD* set; she is superb, and I have no doubt that (as the late John Lennon would say) a splendid time is guaranteed for all. As it happens, I'm also not entirely unfamiliar with artists having "visa problems" in recent years; among other things, the situation has put U.S. appearances by jazz organist (real pipes as well as tonewheels) Barbara Dennerlein on hold for several years now.

I was also delighted when I first noticed that the program is an early afternoon performance: that way, I don't have to choose between it and Wayne Marshall's appearance that evening at Disney Hall. So even if you have Disney Hall tickets for that evening, you still have no excuse for missing Dr. Luedecke.

On the production side, I've recently taken delivery on a reconditioned laser printer, the same model as the beat-up one I've been using. Unfortunately, one of the side panels shattered in shipping, so it's been stuck at my office for a while, adding to the delays in this issue.
