
Here are a couple of organ and brass selections to get you in the mood of our next meeting on November.





From the Press Room

James H. H. Lampert, Typesetter and Printer

Greetings from back home. My Fall Vacation went well, and the only glitch I'm aware of with the distribution of the October Principal was a single bad email address on my tablet. I hope that all those who receiv the print edition received it on time, and that they noticed the Chicago postmark. While on vacation, I made it to a concert and three interesting church services (renewing my friendship with rather well-known organist Peter Sykes in the process), and managed to audition four CDs for my annual Christmas bulk-order.

I was not able to make it to Mr. Wolter's reading session, as it did have a direct conflict with my docent shift at the Printing Museum, and in this case, with the Museum's biggest event of the year, the annual Los Angeles Printers' Fair. I did, however, make it to Renée Anne Louprette's recital at Disney Hall, on October 7th. If anybody cares to read my impressions of it, they can be found at

I'll also note that new Chapter member Stephen Karr performed recently at All Souls, in San Diego; I wasn't able to make it down there for that one.

The unusually large number of email blasts that Russ and others had to send out in my absence (and my missing any opportunity to go down to San Diego to hear Stephen on the delightful All Souls Fritts) brings up a point: if you want to promote an event, you should start promoting it as early as possible, maybe even before you're certain of the date, or the venue, or even whether it will happen at all. There were a number of October events that could have made it into the October Principal (and probably should have made it into the August/September *Principal* as well), if only Russ and I had known about them in advance. Whenever there's an unusual press deadline for The Principal, we do our best to make sure it doesn't catch anybody by surprise, but even if this had been a perfectly normal deadline, you can hardly expect people to show up for an event if the first they hear of it is only a week (or less) in advance. And as always, I stand ready to create a free flyer for your event, on very short notice.

Organ Study Scholarship Program

Guidelines

Long Beach Chapter American Guild of Organists

The Long Beach Chapter of the American Guild of Organists is offering an organ study scholarship competition to promote the development of new and continuing organ students.

The following guidelines apply to this competition:

The scholarship applicant must be currently studying organ or piano with a teacher who is a member of Long Beach AGO.

Applicants must be 24 years old or younger.

For piano/organ students who meet the qualifications, \$250.00 per winner will be awarded. The student will be given a list of approved organ teachers, and the scholarship award will go to the teacher of their choice to pay for lessons.

Three adjudicators will be provided, who will give both written and oral comments to the students. The adjudicators' decision as to which students are qualified for scholarship awards will be final.

A \$20 application fee will be assessed from those students who are not members of the Long Beach AGO chapter.

The enclosed application form gives the performance requirements.

Previous scholarship winners who have claimed their award are not eligible.
