Good-Bye to Al Hess

Alton C. Hess, a long-time Long Beach chapter member passed, in his sleep, from this life on August 5, 2023 at the age of 90. For several years he has suffered the effects of dementia, which precluded his attendance at public events.

For more than three decades "Al" was the much beloved organist/choirmaster at Bay Shore Congregational Church. In addition to his work at Bayshore church, Al was an executive in the funeral insurance industry, which afforded him the opportunity be extremely generous to various organizations that were special to him.

Al and Joe (Hix) his partner, acquired and restored the Loynes house at the corner of Ocean Boulevard and Lindero, where he hosted several AGO fall picnics as well as his annual festive Christmas parties benefiting the Hillsides Homes for Children. The engraved invitations to the Christmas parties were greatly anticipated. Invitees were asked to provide an unwrapped toy for a child. Toys were placed at the foot of a 20' Christmas tree positioned in front of the living room window. Arriving guests to the catered affair were met with klieg lights and valets to park their cars; and entertainment was provided by David Koehring and the choirboys from St. Luke's church's well known choir of men and boys.

Over 35 years ago, Al and Joe moved to and restored the now 100 year old "Surfside Cottage", just one-block west of the Loynes house, at Kennebec Avenue, where Al assisted Joe in his business, "Bluff Park Rare Books", made famous by Oprah Winfrey; and ultimately retired from Bay Shore Church, but he continued his connection with the church until illness precluded his attendance.

He is survived by his husband/partner of 58 years, Joe Hix. At his request, there were no services. Al's body was interred during a private ceremony in his crypt at Forest Lawn Sunnyside.

Submission Guidelines

Ladies and Gentlemen, this is *your* newsletter. I just put it together, and add my own comments at the end.

Remember, this is not an M\$-Word-based operation, and hasn't been since I took it over. So if you submit articles, announcements, job postings, and so forth in DOC or DOCX format, you're just making more work for me (and possibly causing a delay, if I don't have access to either my office or my Chromebook). I don't expect anybody here to be able to send me materials in the ideal format for my (WP5.1) WordPerfect/Xerox Ventura Publisher workflow, but sending it as either plain text, RTF, or the body of a plain text email would save me a great deal of time.


Likewise, if you have a full-page insert, such as a flyer, a PDF would be a good choice.

Pictures can be in JPEG, PNG, TIFF, or any other format that GIMP (GNU Image Manipulation Program) can read; ideal width for a column-wide image is 487 or 650 pixels; ideal width for a page-wide image is 1050 or 1400 pixels. And please, if you send me something that's more than a megabyte or two, warn me before I start downloading something huge through a limited-bandwidth connection.

And finally, remember that a column-inch is one column wide, by one inch high. This entire article, including the header, is about 5 column-inches.

As I type this, the Los Angeles Philharmonic is now in the third week of the Hollywood Bowl subscription season, and I've been through a week in which Dudamel conducted a Tuesday evening program of music I'd never heard before, by Francisco Cortés-Álvarez, Arturo Márquez, and Alberto Ginastera, followed by a Thursday evening program of familiar favorites by Prokofiev and Tchaikovsky. Both programs were absolutely magnificent, and the former illustrates the value of *not* rejecting a concert out-of-hand simply because the music is unfamilar.

August 23, 2023:

As I finally get this newsletter together, the Bowl season has continued with one remarkable performance after another (with the storm thankfully arriving after the Tchaikovsky Spectacular).
