November Members' Recital:

Transcriptions at the Organ

We are very pleased once again to return to Bay Shore Community Congregational Church (5100 E. The Toledo) Tuesday November 14th at 7:00pm for a members recital, featuring Robert Gaylord, Russ Litchfield, and Emma Yim. Here is what we know as of press time:

Robert Gaylord has announced his plan to perform J.S. Bach's transcription of the Vivaldi concerto for 2 violins and orchestra. He goes on to say:

"Every time I've heard it on organ, I have wondered why Bach wrote one thing or another that didn't seem quite right, compared to the orchestral original. If time permits, I'll check the library for musicological analyses, but just listening to recorded versions, I detect a few things which could use a bit of improvement. Heresy! Dare I second-guess the great master? If St. Cecelia herself doesn't strike me with a thunderbolt, I hope to implement a change or two, since a 3-manual instrument will be available."

Russ Litchfield plans to play a transcription by Henry Ley of the slow movement, Andante Sostenuto, from Ralph Vaughan Williams' first symphony, "A Sea Symphony." The symphony is a choral piece: the texts of the four movements are taken from Leaves of Grass by Walt Whitman, referring to the sea but also to the journey of the soul.

Russ first encountered this piece in tenth grade when his high school choir learned and presented the symphony with professional orchestra and soloists.

Emma Yim has announced plans to play the Prelude in Bb Major by Clara Schumann, arr. for organ by Barbara Harbach, Cantina Band by John Williams, arr. by Emma Yim, and the first ("Nicht zu schnell") of Robert Schumann's Six Canonic Études Op. 56 (written for pedal piano).

As always, recital programs are subject to change Many thanks to Bay Shore's resident organist and LBAGO member Jason McNally for helping performers access the instrument and arranging for our use of the church free of charge; you won't want to miss it!

As I type this, my vintage "bionic desk lamp" iMac has had its "brain transplant" and is working better than it had worked in years.

My first visit to Disney Hall for the new season (which also involved my first ride on the new downtown "regional connector" on the Blue Line) was "all-star chamber music": Lisa Batiashvili, Gautier Capuçon, and Jean-Yves Thibaudet, playing piano trios by Haydn, Ravel, and Mendelssohn, and I learned that both the Haydn and the Ravel had their slow movements in passacaglia form. Two passacaglias, and they couldn't possibly be more different. All they had in common was that each danced around a basso ostinato. But they started with very different ostinatos, and took them in entirely different directions.

My next visit to Disney Hall will be two days before our own November program, and it will be James McVinnie opening the Organ Recital series (two days before our Members' Recital – no time conflicts!).
